Long-Acting Reversible Contraception


- Consultations should include a conversation with the person regarding alternative and more effective forms of contraception, e.g., Long-acting reversible contraception (LARC)
- There are four long-acting reversible contraception methods - intrauterine device (copper coil), intrauterine system (hormonal coil), contraceptive injection or implant
- Information on other forms of contraception can be found at the <u>Contraception Choices</u> website
- Long-acting reversible contraception should also be offered to those attending the pharmacy for emergency hormonal contraception (EHC)






What are the Benefits?

- High efficacy (>99%)
- High continuation rates
- Multiple non-contraceptive benefits
- Long-lasting protection
- Convenient
- Decreased risk of ectopic pregnancy
- Cost-effective
- Quick return of fertility after removal
- No interference with sex
- Discreet







Where to Signpost for LARC?

- GPs: Many offer IUDs alongside other methods of Long-Acting Reversible Contraception (LARC). Details of GPs can be found on the interactive map here or check with a specific Practice:



- Free Self testing kits, contraceptive pill, emergency contraception available via digital services (SH:24) Must be Hertfordshire resident




Community Pharmacy






Contraception Champion Scheme
